Moving forward, I would like to keep working on completing the installation of the Living Shoreline on the Avon banks of Sylvan Lake and working with Bradley Beach on a Project that will involve treating the water entering the Lake and dredging it. These measures will dramatically improve the Lake as a resource for our community, including the control of the geese population.

With my fellow Commissioners, I would like to also work on the enhancement of our downtown area, including addressing parking for our stores and restaurants and supporting our businesses with events such as Avon Day and Shop Local Day.

I look forward to having creation of our annual Avon the opportunity to work with our next Board of Commissioners, Borough Staff, and Borough Volunteers to address our residents' concerns and the Borough priorities over the next four years."




