



BELMAR/LAKE COMO

The Belmar/Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade is returning for a stroll down Main Street on Sunday, March 3 beginning at 12:30 p.m. on 22 Avenue in Lake Como. Get ready for one of the most famous and largest St. Patrick's Day parades in New Jersey.

This year is the first time that there will be four grand marshals – Edward Neafsey and the Casserly sisters, Michelle, Kacey, and Meghan Levis. These individuals embody the spirit of the Irish American community and have made significant contributions to the community and promotion of Irish heritage.

All attendees should expect to be one of roughly 200,000 spectators viewing the over 5,000 marchers and roughly 50 bands, if previous years are anything to go by.



Four grand marshals set for St. Patrick's Day parade

or the first time in the parade's history, four individuals have been chosen to lead the annual Belmar/Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade.

The three Casserly sisters [Michelle, Kacey and Megan], alongside Edward Neafsey, will be honored together as grand marshals of the 51st St. Patrick's Day Parade, scheduled for Sunday, March 3.

HON, EDWARD NEAFSEY

Mr. Neafsey is a decorated Irish-American who has been a Jersey Shore resident for four decades. Born in Elizabeth and raised in Linden with his seven siblings, Mr. Neafsey is the oldest child

of Edward "Bud" Neafsey Jr. — a former grand marshal, himself — and Agnes Murphy Neafsey. whose families have ties to County Cork and Wexford in Ireland, thus securing him dual citizenship.

He has previously worked as a career public

servant at the county, state and federal levels, though most of his work had been with the state, with various roles as assistant counsel and commissioner for enforcement to governors and authoring various published legal pieces.

He was also a certified criminal trial attorney, monitoring murder cases as a military lawyer, defense attorney, prosecutor and judge. Additionally, he served as an active member of the New Jersey State Bar Association for more than 45 years and spent time as a coach and judge in the Mock Trial

Program for high school students pursuing law, according to a press release.

In present day, he serves on the New Jersey State Bar Association's Board of Trustees and is an adjunct professor at Rutgers Law School. He is also a long-time member of FSOS Foundation and the NJ State Hibernians Freedom for All Ireland Chair.

Mr. Neafsey is also a member of the Committee on the Administration of Justice, a Belfast, Ireland-based human rights group.

When the state Legislature's bipartisan resolution designating March as Irish-American Month was signed into law in 2022, it recognized notable Irish-Americans from New Jersey, which included the Jersey Shore judge for his "human rights activism," the press release says.

The former public servant was named "Irishman of the Year" by the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, in Union County, and by the Friendly Sons of the Shillelagh of the Jersey Shore, of Belmar.

"Ed's late wife Jane supported the Belmar & Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade and she held an open house every parade day," stated the press release. "Ed is humbled and honored to follow in the footsteps of his father, who was the 2008 parade Grand Marshal, and his sister Margaret, who was the 2019 Deputy Grand Marshal."

"To be Grand Marshal is very special. I do think of my father who was grand marshal in 2008 and my sister Margaret who was deputy grand marshal in 2018," said Mr. Neafsey in the press release, "It is a special honor for me and for my family. I'm excited to march and represent the strong and the proud Jersey Shore Irish-American community."

CASSERLY SISTERS

For the three Casserly sisters, the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade has become a long-standing tradition. The eldest three of four children of Michael and Joan Ann Casserly, the family grew up in Sussex County and are all graduates from High Point Regional High School.

The siblings all share treasured memories of attending the annual parade since childhood, as their Irish heritage is an important part of their family. According to the press release, their ancestral roots can be traced back to their paternal great-great-grandfather to County Roscommon. who emigrated to America through Ellis Island.

The Casserly family frequently includes bagpipes at their family events, stated the press release, as several aunts, uncles and cousins are members of the Staten Island Pipes and Drums, the Port Authority Pipes and Drums and the Friendly Sons of Shillelagh Jersey Shore Pipe

Growing up as parade attendees from Jersey

City to the Jersey Shore, the sisters have been proud Belmar Parade Committee members since 2013, after being introduced to the committee by former Deputy Grand Marshal Sharon Day.

The sisters first began their involvement with the annual parade celebration by designing and selling commemorative parade T-shirts to help fundraising efforts, which is a tradition that has continued through to this year, as well.

"The Casserly sisters are truly humbled and honored to be part of a storied Irish tradition which is incredibly meaningful for their entire family and all of their friends," stated the press release. "They are exceedingly proud of their heritage and the characteristics that it represents: loyalty, resiliency, friendliness, hospitality and a strong sense of community."

MICHELLE CASSERLY

The eldest sister, Michelle, has been involved in Belmar for the majority of her professional career and has been a die-hard sports fan all of her life.

According to the press release, the grand marshal previously worked in communications in Charlotte, North Carolina. She then returned to New Jersey, working with the Jersey Shore BlueClaws baseball team in Lakewood and later gained experience in other industries, including hospitality and pharmaceuticals, before moving to the nonprofit sector.

In April 2022, she moved to the role of senior events & experiential manager, government systems with Viasat, a global communications company. According to the press release, since joining the California-based company, she has traveled around the world.

Michelle also previously served on the Belmar Zoning Board and served as a volunteer basketball and soccer coach for the Belmar Recreation Department.

"Our favorite part of the parade season and parade weekend are the opportunities to bring people together to celebrate our Irish culture and heritage," Michelle stated in the press release. "We are excited to see all of the smiling faces and folks wearing shamrocks and are praying for a great weather day."

KATHLEEN 'KACEY' CASSERLY

Kacey, the middle Casserly sister, received her degree in elementary education and history from The College of New Jersey and has been a teacher in the Matawan Aberdeen School District for close to two decades, the committee said.

She also possesses both a graduate degree in special education and a master of arts degree in reading from New Jersey City University.

Kacey has also worked for the Belmar beach-

front, working her way up from badge checker to co-director of operations. She was also recently sworn in to serve on the Belmar Library Board of Trustees.

"Being named one of this year's grand marshals is an exciting honor and to share this honor with my sisters, Megan and Michelle, is truly special," Kacey stated in the press release. "I've been fundraising for the parade for almost a decade and it's been an opportunity to connect with the people of Belmar. It's moments like this that make me proud to call Belmar home."

MEGAN LEVIS NÉE CASSERLY

Megan, the youngest sister in the trio, played soccer, basketball and softball through her school years and attended The College of New Jersey, where she graduated with a degree in elementary education and history.

Following her graduation, she moved to Belmar, where she worked on the beachfront while completing postgraduate studies at New Jersey City University. She started her career as a special education teacher in 2008 in the Marlboro School District and later joined the staff of Belmar Elementary School in 2016, where she currently teaches.

Megan met her husband, Belmar Councilman Mark Levis, on an "Irish night" at Connolly Station in 2008 and later got engaged during their first trip to Ireland in August 2011, while they were visiting the Aran Island, Inis Mór.

The pair were married at St. Rose Church the following year and since have three kids together [Molly, 10, Morgan, 8, and Max, 5] who have also grown up enjoying the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade celebrations, just like their mother.

PARADE DAY

With a large Irish-American presence on the Jersey Shore, the annual Belmar/Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade is a celebration of culture that includes music, food and entertainment.

Spectators can enjoy floats that will be in the theme of Saint Patrick and Irish or Celtic American heritage, barraged with green colors and decorations.

The parade will commence at 12:30 p.m., starting on 22nd Avenue and heading north on Main Street, ending on Fifth Avenue, according to the parade's website. Attendees should expect to be one of roughly 200,000 spectators viewing the over 5,000 marchers and roughly 50 bands, if previous years are anything to go by.

POSE WITH ART AT GROUNDS FOR SCULPTURE



Local book shops fulfill the need to read

Booksellers share perspectives on how indie bookstores survive — and thrive — along the Jersey Shore

brated a significant milestone, especially in the life of a small, independent business — five years of operation. The Little Point Bookshop has become something of a hub for readers in northern Ocean County, noted for its events and its location on Arnold Avenue. Night & Day recently sat down for interviews with several booksellers — the Little Point Bookshop in Point Beach as well as Spring Lake's Thunder Road Books and Manasquan's BookTowne — to

Kelly Coyle Crivelli, the owner of Little Point Bookshop who works in publishing by trade, began by explaining how she came to own the Little Point Bookshop in the first place.

"I have a big family; my mom is retired. I had three kids at the time who were going to college ... and I said, 'I need to do a little something else,'" she said. Ms. Coyle, who is from Freehold originally, said that she was initially seeking out a spot in her hometown. "I wanted to figure out something to keep my mom busy — something we could do together ... So, we decided to open a little bookstore."


"There was a spot there I wanted to open the store in originally," she said, pointing just across the street from the Little Point Bookshop's current location. "My sister and I were walking past that little store across the street... [we said] 'let's just try it; if it doesn't work, it doesn't work. But then it just kept working."

She told Night & Day that the bookshop faced a big hurdle immediately after its opening, due to the COVID pandemic. However, she explained, the business managed to adapt to the new status quo by setting up a successful book delivery service to remain plugged-in to the community.

"What happened was ... we got more dedicated customers, because we were able to connect closer," she said. "People that usually went back to their regular houses — not their shore houses — during COVID just stayed ... we got more of a loyal following during COVID. We were here, we were open, we did as many events outdoors as possible ... we stayed connected."

Kate Czyzewski, the general manager of Thunder Road Books, told Night & Day that there had been a bookstore, Fireside Books, in Spring Lake before Thunder Road's founding by film producer and New Jersey native Basil Iwanyk. However, she said that it was quite some time since that store was operational, according to her customers.

"When we talked about opening in May of 2021, the [Spring Lake] families were already super excited when we were under construction because there hadn't been a bookstore there in so long," she said, "and obviously the downtown of Spring Lake is such a thriving downtown, so it made sense that a bookstore would be here."



Downtown areas and bookstores tend to go together frequently, as observers might notice on a stroll down a given main street. Local downtowns are bolstered by having such independent, unique perspectives and bespoke experiences, say the booksellers.

Peter Albertelli, owner of Manasquan's local bookstore BookTowne, said that many of his customers have expressed to him just how grateful they are to have such an institution as BookTowne right around the corner.

"I have customers coming in all the time that ... feel like it's a necessity to have a community bookstore," he said, noting that "... a bookstore is passion, creativity and a community that supports you — those are the three main keys, I think, of an independent bookstore."

He also said that one of the biggest advantages, for customers, in going to an independent bookstore as opposed to a large chain is the personalized aspect of having a local vendor — and fellow literature fan — give recommendations. His position was echoed by Ms. Coyle.

"I think we keep it personal," said Ms. Coyle. "We don't have a ton of everything; we have a very curated list of books ... it's not as overwhelming. People enjoy that; some people come in and they don't even look. They just come in and ask you, 'OK, what am I reading next?' You get to know what people like."

For some booksellers, the gig was not their first. For example, prior to owning BookTowne, which he has for five years, Mr. Albertelli worked in the music industry. However, he did say that his life and many of his experiences have somewhat centered around words and their sheer power.


"It's not a long story ... The effect of words on me has been a part of my entire life," said Mr. Albertelli, who studied theater at New York University. "The playwright's words in a script have affected me; I worked in the music industry for 27 years, so the lyrics from the songwriter have affected me; now, I own a bookstore here and the words on the page affect me."

Mr. Albertelli had worked as a music programmer on MTV and music marketer for his own promotion company, working with such pop icons as Lady Gaga. He began working part-time at BookTowne after leaving his nearly three-decade career in the music industry. Eventually, he took the keys to the store from previous owner Rita Maggio.

"Words are magic," he said. "I feel like putting words together in a certain way totally affects me."

Ms. Czyzewski told Night & Day that she met Mr. Iwanyk, owner and founder of Thunder Road Books, following an author event in town. She had attended the event as part of her hobby as a "bookstagrammer" — a term for someone who blogs on Instagram about literature. The owner of Whimsicality, the interior design shop where the event was held, took Ms. Czyzewski's number, calling her a year-and-a-half later with an offer from Mr. Iwanyk to help run his store.

"Basil grew up in New Jersey, moved out to [Los Angeles], struck it big with the film industry, and ... during COVID, he and his three young boys decided to come back to Spring Lake and ride out the pandemic. In Spring Lake it was a little less chaotic than out in L.A. for the boys, and they fell in love with being year-rounders in Spring Lake."

She said that, like many patrons of indie bookstores. Mr. Iwanyk would seek out local bookstores on his down time when he was traveling, sparking him to try his hand at the trade.

"What he loved very much when he was traveling to film for his film company was that he always found bookstores in his travels," she said. Mr. Iwanyk is known in the film industry for having produced movies like "Sicario" as well as the John Wick series of films, "During the hustle and the bustle of filming and all of those projects that took him around the world, it was a relaxing thing for him to always find the neighborhood bookstore wherever he was filming. And he felt that Spring Lake needed that."

Ms. Coyle told Night & Day that they held a big party for the store's actual birthday, which was Feb. 3. While the milestone feels important, she said, the staff of Little Point Bookshop aims to simply keep that strong bond between the store and the community as healthy as possible through their events and thoughtful curation.

"People have maybe become more passionate about their small towns since COVID, and remembered how important they are," said Ms. Coyle.

While it isn't easy to be an independent bookseller by any means, these small businesses act as social pillars for the community, and their popularity and staying-power paint a hopeful picture of the future. With Little Point Bookshop's triumphal fifth birthday in the rearview, as well as other indie bookstores in Monmouth and Ocean thriving in their own downtowns, it will be little wonder when more birthdays are celebrated in the years to come.
