Upcoming races to support your health and local charities

For those looking for a good opportunity for athletic competition or overall fitness, or to support a good cause, races are one of the best ways to do that.

On April 6, RunAPalooza brought runners from all over to run along various parts of the Jersey Shore: the Jersey Shore Relay Marathon, the Asbury Park Half Marathon and the Jersey Shore 5K.

The Jersey Shore Running Club has recently hosted an array of running events for all local hobby joggers. The Jersey Shore Relay Marathon combines team competition and individual performances across five legs spanning 26.2 miles from the boardwalk in Seaside Heights to the finish line in Asbury Park. The competition raised money for the Jersey Shore Dream Center and saw 143 teams complete the coastal trek to finish on the Asbury Park Boardwalk, traversing some of New Jersey's most scenic landscapes for a good cause.

"Not only did we have to rely on our teammates to hand off the baton, but on the staff who were spread out over the 26 miles," said Jeff Burdge, a runner in the relay marathon. "Every individual worked together to make it an unforgettable day."

Of course, things will only continue to heat up on the race front as summer approaches.

Below are some races in Monmouth and Ocean counties (listed chronologically) taking place in the coming months that both provide a chance for runners to test their mettle and raise money for local charities. Whether new or a long standing tradition, each has a story behind it.

Some of them fill up quickly, so don't miss the opportunity to sign up and lace up!

LAKE COMO 5K

The 19th Annual Lake Como Spring Break 5K Run and 2-Mile Walk will return to the streets of Lake Como, Belmar and Spring Lake later this month on Saturday, April 27.

Online registration costs \$40 until Tuesday, April 23; afterwards, late registration will cost \$45 and can be done in-person at bib and T-shirt pickup locations prior to the race. Bib and T-shirt pickup can be found at Bar Anticipation on Friday, April 26 from 5 to 7 p.m.



and Saturday, April 27 from 8 to 9:45 a.m. Race T-shirts will be given to all pre-registered runners and walkers; post-registrants can receive T-shirts while supplies last.

The fundraiser will be a rain-or-shine event. Racers will be chip timed by CompuScore. For more information and to sign up for the race, visit runsignup.com/Race/Info/NJ/LakeComo/JSRCLakeComo5K.

The annual race is hosted by the Jersey Shore Running Club [JSRC], in partnership with Bar Anticipation. The club hosts many races throughout the area to raise funds for various local charities.

"Primarily, we are charity focused, and want to provide a great race experience to our runners while giving the largest donation possible to our charities," Race Director and JSRC Board Member Vicki Trerotola said. "The Lake Como Spring Break 5K is a club race that has been going on for 19 years and we've been trying to build it bigger each year. We're expecting to have well over 500 runners this year."

The fundraising event will raise proceeds for Tunnels to Towers in conjunction with Team Shamrock. Team Shamrock is a Spring Lake Heights-based fundraising organization honoring the memory of Donald W. Robertson Jr., a victim of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

"Tunnel to Towers is a worthwhile organization that raises money for American first responders, veterans and their families. It is an excellent charity," Trerotola said.

"Once again, we're honored and proud to be the recipients of the funds from this popular run," said Kathy Cunningham, a board member for the Tunnels to Tower Foundation and founder of Team Shamrock.

"This is our third year involved with the Spring Break 5K and it's a great day to run and show your pride for America, the Tunnels to Towers, and to give back and to make a difference in the lives of our veterans and first responders, as well as our homeless veterans," she said.

Following a rendition of the national anthem, the race will kick off that Saturday at Bar Anticipation at 10 a.m. [walk will start shortly after], when participants will take to a slightly-altered course from previous years through borough streets for either a 5-kilometer run or 2-mile walk.

"We're always trying to improve the quality of our races and we feel this slightly altered course will be better for our runners," said Trerotola.

Late registration, along with bib and T-shirt pickup, will take place before the race as well starting at 8 a.m.

A post-race party at Bar Anticipation will immediately follow the race with a complimentary barbeque [drinks not included], along with entertainment and prize giveaways. Prizes

will be awarded for first, second and third place finishers overall, as well as for first through third place finishers in ten-year age groups.

"At 11 [a.m.], we will announce the winners, and after that we have some random prizes donated by local businesses, like restaurant gift cards, products and beach badges," Trerotola said. "The barbecue at Bar A is always a great time."

The Tunnels to Towers Foundation is a 501[c] [3] nonprofit organization dedicated to honoring the sacrifice of firefighter Stephen Siller, who died during the 9/11 terrorist attacks. The organization aims to honor the country's military and first responders who continue to make supreme sacrifices in the line of duty, according to its website.

One initiative of the organization is its Smart Home Program, where armed service members returning from war who have been catastrophically injured are built smart technology homes to help them to regain their independence. More information on how to donate, as well as upcoming events, can be found on the organization's website, t2t.org.

SUPERHERO 5K RUN

Wall Township will have a run of superheroes in late April, the Superhero 5K Run. The Superhero Training Camp and 5K Run will be held Sunday, April 28 at Wall Community Park—located at 1870 Bailey's Corner Road—encouraging kids and adults to dress as their favorite superheroes for a kids' obstacle course and adult 5K run.

The kids obstacle will start at 9:15 a.m. Participants in both races are welcome to "run, walk or fly" through the course to help raise funds for the recreation department for its future events. The adults' race will start at 10 a.m. Bib pickup for the race is at 8:45 a.m.

The cost for Wall Township residents to race is \$25; non-residents can sign up for \$35. Children under two years old are free with a paid adult.

Wall Recreation's scheduled rain date for the race is the following weekend, Sunday, May 5. Registration is open until Friday, April 26. The website for registration is register.community-pass.net/wall under "Spring Programs."

BAY HEAD 5K

The 19th Annual Bay Head 5k Memory Run kicks off on Saturday, May 18 at 8:30 a.m., with registration beginning at 6:30 a.m.

Registration costs \$40 per person registering as an individual or \$35 if as a team. Registration will be at the Bay Head Firehouse, 81 Bridge Avenue. A T-shirt and race bag are included in the registration cost. For more information and to sign-up, visit bayhead5k.com.

There will be an after party following the race

from 12 to 4 p.m. at Martell's Tiki Bar in Point Pleasant Beach which will include an open bar and beach BBQ. This costs \$60 per person.

The race was created by The Kate Shea Foundation [KSF]. KSF was founded by loving friends and family of Kate Shea in order to give back to the community she called home most summers of her short, but fulfilling life. Kate was an inspiration to the community all in the way she lived her life in an accepting and open-minded way.

The proceeds from the Bay Head 5K will go to The KSF to support its mission of providing funds to research organizations fighting cancers and youth education. The Kate Shea Foundation has raised over \$300,000 for cancer research and education since it began in 2004.

BIKE MS: COAST THE COAST 2024

This bicycling event is presented by Bike MS, which offers many such routes across the nation in support of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society [NMSS].

One of the races takes place on May 11 this year, starting and ending at the Deal Casino Beach Club at 125 Ocean Ave. North in Deal. Four routes will be offered: a 100 mile starting at 6:30 a.m., a 75 mile starting at 7 a.m., a 50 mile starting at 8:30 a.m. and a 25 mile starting at 9:30 a.m. The race will be rain or shine.

Register on the NMSS website at events. nationalmssociety.org. Select "Bike MS," then "find your ride." You will be navigated to a new page with a search bar into which you can enter "coast the coast."

Parking is available in the club parking lot. Check-in begins at 6 a.m. Routes close at 4 p.m. Riders in the longer routes should maintain certain speeds in order to finish the course before the routes close.

There will be a re-ride logistics call on April 25 at 6:30 p.m. to prepare riders for the event. A completed waiver and a \$250 fundraising minimum is required to pick up the pre-race packet. Packet pickups take place the morning of the ride from 6 to 6:30 a.m., 6 to 7 a.m., 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. and 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. for the 100, 75, 50 and 25 mile routes respectively. Each route includes rest stops.

SPRING LAKE FIVE MILE RUN

Also known as the Spring Lake 5, this race is made up of two separate runs and will take place Memorial Day weekend. The Kids Race will take place Friday, May 24 at 6 p.m., whereas the Five Mile Run will be held on Saturday, May 25 at 8:30 a.m., rain or shine. The race will be chip-timed.

Registration for the five-mile sold out in under seven hours on Feb 11, but bib numbers can still be acquired through the race's charity partners by visiting the run website at thespringlakefive-



milerun.rsupartner.com and navigating to the "Charities & Donations" tab. In that tab. a full list of charities is available. Hopeful runners are asked to contact the charities directly.

The Kids Race is itself a series of races of different lengths based on age groups: children under four years old will run 25 yards, four-yearolds will run 50 yards, five and six-year-olds will run 100 yards, seven and eight-year olds will run 200 yards, nine and 10-year-olds will run 400 yards and kids from age 11 to 14 will run a guarter mile.

Each racer in the Kids Race will receive a medal, but there will be no awards for winners. as the runs are meant to be casual, rather than competitive. Registration for the Kids Race is available online until May 15 at noon. A link to online registration can be found on the run website in the "Race Registration" tab.

Each racer in the adult race will receive a commemorative glass, which can be picked up at the pre-race packet pickup or the morning of the race at the glass tent on Ocean Avenue. Race number bibs will be mailed in early May.

The race begins on Ocean Avenue past Sussex Avenue, and ends on Ocean Avenue just past Salem Avenue. There will be four water stations along the course.

According to the race website, the Spring Lake 5 began in 1977 as runs were becoming more popular around the nation. It was organized by the Spring Lake Recreation Committee and the council. It was first held on Memorial Day and attracted more than 500 runners. Since then, it has continued to grow.

Some of the key sponsors named on the race's website include Jersey Mike's, Hackensack Meridian Health and Circle BMW.

Headphones, earbuds and similar devices will be prohibited as well as strollers, dogs, skateboards, in-line skates, roller skates and bicycles. Parking will be limited. Streets east of Third Avenue will be closed, and all parking will be prohibited along the race course.

NAV-E-SINK OR SWIM DISTANCE FESTIVAL

This is a swimming race on May 26 at Victory Park in Rumson. There will be three distances; 2.4 miles, 1.6 miles and 0.6 miles; and a kids

The 2.4 mile race will start at 7:45 a.m. The 1.6 mile race starts at 8:15 a.m. The 0.6 mile race starts at 8:30 a.m. The kids race, for those 12 years or younger, will be a 300-yard swim beginning at 9:30.

All swimmers must be out of the water by 9:40 a.m. without exception: anyone still in the water will be removed.

Packets can be picked up at the race location on May 25 from 5 to 6:30 p.m. or the day of the race at 6:45 a.m. There will be awards for the top three overall, male and female swimmers as well as the top three male and female swimmers in each of the following age groups: 14 or younger, 15 to 19, 20 to 29, 30 to 39, 40 to 49, 50 to 59, 60 to 69, 70 to 79 and 80 or older.

TOUR OF SOMERVILLE

Established in 1940, the Tour of Somerville is the oldest bike race in America, according to its website. Now in its 79th year, it will take place on Memorial Day, May 27 and travel through downtown Somerville, NJ.

Register at bikereg.com/tourofsomerville#Register. The registration deadline is May 23 at 5 p.m. The course is a four-corner criterium. Though it is a race, participants may marvel at the bustling downtown area as they ride.

The schedule of events will be as follows: a family fun ride at 8 a.m., the Memorial Day Parade at 8:30 a.m., staggered-start races for girls ages nine to 14 and 15 to 18 and boys ages nine to 13 at 9:25 a.m., a masters race for men 55 years and older at 9:55 a.m., a men categories four and novice race at 10:40 a.m., a women categories three four and novice race at 11:20 a.m., a masters race for men 40 years and older at noon, a race for boys ages 15 to 18 at 12:55 p.m., a men categories two and three race at 1:50 p.m., the Milred Kugler women's pro/1/2/3 race at 3 p.m. and the Kugler-Anderson Memorial men's pro/1/2 race at 4:25 p.m.

Register for the family fun ride at communitypass.net/somerville. A map of nearby parking can be found on the race's website, tourofsomerville.com/cyclist-information.

Cycling racers must have a valid USA Cycling license. One-day licenses will be available at bikereg.com at the time of registration.

AVON 5K RUN/WALK

The 2024 Avon Run/Walk is set for Saturday, June 1 from 8:30 a.m. to noon beginning at Ocean and Norwood avenues, along a scenic flat route through town, with clocks and water stops at each mile. Registration is capped at 1,500 participants, so if interested, it is best to register

sooner than later.

The race costs \$25 per runner, or walker, in support of the Avon Volunteer First Aid Squad, with all proceeds going directly back to the squad to assist with operations. Prices will increase for those who register after May 17.

Shirts are guaranteed to the first 1,200 registered runners and all are automatically entered into a post-race raffle for season beach badges to Avon beach.

The race website notes, "The Avon Volunteer First Aid Squad is a not-for-profit, 501c(3) organization that provides emergency medical and rescue services 24 hours a day, seven days a week, at no charge, to residents and visitors to Avon-By-The-Sea," it continues stating that, "It has provided these services since 1931. The squad is staffed by volunteer EMTs and relies entirely on charitable contributions for all operating expenses."

A kids' run is also organized by the Avon Home and School Association alongside the 5K. A registration link is typically posted on the school's website sometime in May – for updates check out Avonschool.com.

Early number and shirt pickup is set for Thursday, May 30 from 5 to 7 p.m. and Friday, May 31 from 6 to 8 p.m., at the Avon First Aid Building located at 520 Main St. Late numbers and shirt pickup is also available on Saturday, June 1 from 7 to 8:30 a.m. at The Pavilion. Lines can be expected if picking up on Saturday.

The race staff will provide post-race refreshments consisting of water, cups of sports drinks and food, which is typically bagels and fruit.

Race results will be available at runsignup. com located at the bottom of the page and will also be posted in hard-copy form on bulletin boards at the Avon Pool, on Norwood Avenue.

This year's sponsors include: RE/MAX real estate company, Deep Water Landing, Jersey Shore Nursing Agency Inc., Frank Lurch Demolition Co LLC and waKs.

POINT BORO ROTARY 5K

The Point Pleasant Boro Rotary Club is gearing up to host its annual Father's Day 5K and Fun Run as part of the organization's efforts to help the community. The race is rain or shine.

The Father's Day 5K race is scheduled for Saturday, June 15. The Fun Run will start at 8 a.m. The 5K kicks off at 8:30 a.m. Each race starts and finishes in Point Pleasant Borough's Community Park at the intersection of Bridge Avenue and Beaver Dam Road.

Online and mail registration is underway. For registrations completed by June 12, the fee is \$20 for the Fun Run and \$30 for the 5K. The fee is \$35 after that date for the 5K. Fun Run registration remains at \$20 up to and including the day of the race.

A dedicated website [runsignup.com/Race/NJ/PointPleasantBoro-RotaryFathersDay5KRun] is available for race information, to review the course map and to register. Pre-registration can be completed also by going to sjtiming.com or can be sent to the Point Boro Rotary, PO Box 496, Point Pleasant, NJ 08742.

Beginning just outside the park on Beach Boulevard, participants will travel through the Bay Head Shores section of town as they make their way to Marine Parkway, Riviera Parkway, Blaze Drive, Barnegat Boulevard and Rue Lafayette.

A trophy will be awarded to the first father to finish. Trophies will be given to the first place male and female finishers in the Fun Run. Food before and a light snack after the race will be on hand for the runners.

Runners pre-registered by June 12 can pick up race packets on Friday, June 14 from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Moose Lodge, 706 River Ave.

The race has always had a Father's Day theme and the initial race was held on June 15, 2008. Since then, there have been changes during the pandemic and post pandemic but the Rotary Club looks for considerable growth in runners, community support and sponsors.

Each race has been geared to provide financial aid to local charities and community based organizations. That focus has expanded to help with food insecurity, Point Pleasant Borough Police Department's LEAD program, veterans organizations and many local organizations.

Mary Guetzlaff, Rotary Club President, said the club "is proud to continue its efforts to help so many worthy causes."

"For a decade our race has been a community-wide and family-friendly event that generates proceeds to help various charities," said Guetzlaff. "We are looking forward to this race as being a resource to aid others."

Race Committee Member Mary Borree said, "Experience has shown the important role the residents, business community, the borough administration, police, recreation and public works departments, Earle Sea Cadets and our first aid squad undertake with us to put a positive face on this event."

Sea Girt Rec offers weekly yoga lineup

CLASSES HELD AT ST. URIEL'S CHURCH

The Sea Girt Recreation Department is offering a slew of new classes as part of its ongoing 2024 yoga program held at St. Uriel's Church.

The classes welcome men and women of all ages, physical abilities and comfort levels in a small-class setting; enter off Third Avenue at Miller

"Sea Girt Recreation Yoga is one of the health and wellness programs Sea Girt's Rec Department offers residents and neighbors," said yoga instructor Anne Britt. "Its purpose is to offer space and programming for people to gather and build community while strengthening their bodies, minds and overall wellness."

The current yoga program has evolved from the original Sea Girt beach yoga program founded and fos-

tered by Kathleen Davis 27 years ago, Ms. Britt said.

Before January of last year, yoga was only offered during the summer on the beach from July through Labor Day, but

since then has expanded to year-round classes at the church, in addition to the already existing beach classes. This spring, programming again expanded to include additional times and class styles, such as Chair Yoga, for residents and visitors alike.

Classes cost \$15 each, which can either be paid in cash or purchased online through CommunityPass on the borough website individually or in multi-class packages at a reduced rate. Students are asked to bring their own mats and a water bottle, and classes are capped at 15 people due to space.

The yoga program holds a variety of classes six days a week with eight instructors, offering various class times throughout the day — early morning, mid morning, lunch time, afternoon and evenina.

Class types include Open Level Yoga [available and accessible for all levels], Forever Fit [yoga and an enhanced strength component], Chair Yoga [a gentle class for people with mobility challenges] and Meditative Movement and Candlelight Yoga, according to Ms. Britt.

Thursdays: Mixed Level Yoga with Anne from 8:45 to 9:45 a.m.: Mixed Level Yoga with Mindy from 7 to 8 p.m.

Mixed Level Yoga instructor Brighde Dougherty took some time to speak with NIght & Day about what her classes offer to students.

Unlike typical yoga exercises, Mixed Level Yoga focuses more heavily on body fullness and applying calmness and grounding not only in the workout room, but teaches students how to utilize the techniques in their everyday


"My class is more of a flow, learning to listen to the body and follow the body's movement, as opposed to a set series of poses," said Ms. Dougherty.

"My goal with every class is in each pose, you're slowing down enough [even if it's a really hard pose, or physically moving fast], you're holding the pose long enough, you're connecting with your breath long enough, you're able to listen — or at a bare minimum connecting with your nervous system — and then you get the chance to sort of choose what direction you want to qo..."

She said that includes discovering how people can ground themselves and connect with their brain and nervous system.

"It is one thing to be calm, cool and collected on your mat; it's a whole other thing to bring those pools into everyday life and that's why I really love teaching in this program," Ms. Dougherty said.

"This whole area, at large, is such a small and just amazing community. If you can help a couple people in their own world, that's only going to ripple out into the rest of the community."





Alpacas on Allaire began its visitation hours earlier this month. 10 female alpacas, who have been residents of the Wall Township farm since 2010, welcome families and couples who happily feed and pet them.

As temperatures warm up, alpaca farms gear up for visitors

all Township is home to not one, but two famous properties that house alpacas and they are ready for your visit, and perhaps you'll take home an item or two made from their coats' soft fleece.

ALPACAS ON ALLAIRE

For \$5, families can visit the property at 2660 Allaire Road and purchase cups of pellet food, perusing around the roughly 4-acre space of land the animals call home, while socializing with them.

"They've been here longer than us, so the idea was to just let them do their thing," said farm owner Lindsay Balsamo. Her and her significant other, Brian Laureano, purchased the 6.5-acre property in July 2023. "...[We] went to Peru on vacation, learned a little bit about them...we realized we really wanted to take this on."

Ranging from ages 5 to 22, each of the 10 female camelids vary in characteristics; some possess spikey hooves and tall, poofy topknots; others are smaller, broader and have short tails. In terms of hue, eight are white and two are brown, All 10 of the alpacas were interested in being fed repeatedly



by approximately 25 visitors who attended March 16's hours, which ran from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Balsamo said, "It's really special. We knew that we wanted to open this up to the community and have them experience how special they can be. It's not everyday that you're coming across an alpaca... and to get to learn a little about how these animals are and interact with them."

Balsamo noted that much like cats, alpacas enjoy their personal space and although they are usually very friendly, she said if a visitor were to aggressively invade their space, "spit happens."

"They can be independent...you can pet them, but they'll let you know when they've had enough."

One alpaca in particular. "Libby," stole the show, lying down in the sun as children pet her head. With her crooked teeth and smile, Libby is of the 99th percentile of size for the entire alpaca species.

Another alpaca "Gio Adagio," one of the two brown inhabitants, is considered the "alpha-female" of the pack, according to Balsamo. The oldest of the group, Gio alerts the rest of the herd if there are any dangers nearby, which includes occasional fox visitors.

"She's definitely the boss of the herd," the owner said. Other names of herd members include "Afromation," "Willow," "Fiona" and "Ladyslipper."

ARROW ACRES FARM

Just three minutes from Alpacas on Allaire, Arrow Acres Farm was once a horse property until the Sherman family decided to take on furry friends. It's located at 2011 Bentz Road, where the site off New Bedford Road is full of real estate for the alpacas to wander; 38 to be exact.

"They're very friendly, very gentle on the whole, they don't like to be touched because they feel defenseless at times," said farm owner Dee Sherman. "We stick the bullies together, the boys and girls are separated, there's comedians... we have personalities."

Ms. Sherman has help from her family. Her husband, Don, mans the tours, handing out carrots and educating guests on the camelid lifestyle. She also has three daughters, Leanne Coppola, Andee Fagan and Liz Alvino, and their seven grandsons who help out around the farm when needed. This involves carrying items, feeding the herds and even witnessing the births that take place on site.

Guests can feel the alpaca fleece, tour the farm, view live demonstrations, learn about raising and breeding alpacas and shop for alpaca products. The farm is open from September to May, with the months of April and May having

hours on Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The farm is roughly 16 acres in size, according to Ms. Sherman.

Tours are free but donations are greatly appreciated to the farm, its website says. Available for purchase are all things from the alpacas' mighty coats; yarn handknit hats and scarves, alpaca coats, socks, gloves, toys, etc.

The farm also does sell alpacas themselves, so if you are interested in purchasing animals or learning how to start a farm, Arrow Acres can assist you in becoming one of roughly 40 alpaca farms across The Garden State.

Some names the alpacas have on the farm are more along the lines of a horse you'd put top dollar on at the local racetrack; "Lamborghini Engine," "Shushy," "Smokering," "Velvet Revolver," "Peanut Butter Dickens," "Stone," "Inky," "Windshift" and "Kigo Abenaki."

"This is just so fun. When all goes well, there's nothing better," said Sherman.

The farm closes in May when the weather starts to get hot to keep the alpacas cool. Sherman said that no one would be willing to purchase warmer wool during the higher temperature months; Peanut Butter, Velvet and Co. stay under awnings with fans surrounding them throughout the Jersey Shore's busiest months.





The Court Jester has a rich history and a richly-flavored buffalo sauce

Walking into The Court Jester in Freehold is a lot like stepping back in time. Maybe it's the hardback books that decorate the shelves of the restaurant, or the historic pictures of Freehold Borough that can be found on the walls throughout the building, "the Jester" as known by locals, houses a lot of the town's history at its 16 East Main Street location.

Partners Tony Ciafardini, Mike Page and Ryan Jones have managed to cultivate a welcoming, delicious and modern dining experience while still honoring the history of downtown Freehold.

The Court Jester has been at its current location for 47 years, but the building is 150 years old. The basement of The Court Jester has served as a speakeasy, a tunnel for booze during Prohibition and a bomb shelter all the way up until the 1970s. Visitors to The Court Jester will likely find themselves more comfortable on the floor above at the bar and restaurant level, but Mike and Tony are

always happy to share stories about the building's unique basement.

If you bring your appetite to either Court Jester location, in Freehold or its Aberdeen location at 1077 NJ 34-A, you'll find a fine-tuned menu that offers diners a wide selection of burgers, sandwiches, salads, entrees and many starters that pair well with a cold pour from the bar.

El Grande Nachos with your choice of chicken or beef are a great shareable starter. Because you can never have enough cheese, the tortilla chips smothered with toppings also come with a side of gueso dip.

The California Chicken Cheeseburger — known to regulars as the CCCB — is grilled chicken

topped with bacon, lettuce, tomato, onion and American cheese, all on a tasty bun. Add a side of mayo or guac to bring this dish home.

Last but not least, is the Buffalo Wings.

"We're known for these," Tony says. The wings are coated and fried and topped with your choice of sauce, but there's really only one choice here. The Court Jester's signature Buffalo wing sauce (which they also sell by the jar) is generously poured atop the cooked-to-perfection wings. Once you try the sauce, you'll know why they also put it on everything, including in their signature bloody marys.

If you take a trip to The Court Jester to satisfy your cravings, you'll also want to peruse their drink menu. The bar has 31 beers on tap, an extensive cocktail menu that includes those of the frozen variety, wine and all your favorite liquor selections.

Music shops around the area prep for Record Store Day

or true music fans, stepping into a music store that specializes in records can feel a lot like going to church.

Just as the holy books in a church preserve the words that serve as the foundational beliefs for millions across the world, so too do records preserve the vibrations that ignite the soul and have also shaped many people's beliefs on everything from governments to relationships.

It is this passion for music that first prompted Matt Kindler, owner of Clarizio Music Center, to expand into record sales two years ago.

In a recent interview with Night & Day, Kindler and his daughter Riley, explained how they came to expand that center to a record store as well, having started with the decades-old music store, which is in the same strip mall as the record department.

"We had this space — which was used for lessons, rock bands, etc. for years, and basically COVID kind of squashed all those programs for us, so this room was just sitting here," Kindler said, referring to the space the record department currently exists in.

"At the same time, our record collection at home was growing and growing," said Riley. "We would watch [1995 comedy film] 'Empire Records' and joke that dad was going to be the grumpy man behind the counter one day."

At Clarizio, a diversity in musical genres is on full display. Looking for some old-school Dolly Parton? There she is. How about some 90s era Tribe Called Quest? One need only move about three sections over to 90s hip hop and there are their albums.

Kindler and Riley explained that the tastes and styles of the prototyp-

RECORD STORE DAY

One day where most record store owners in this area see the gamut of fans is Record Store Day, which this year is scheduled for Saturday, April 20. Every Record Store Day, hundreds of record stores around the world. including Clarizio, as well as Lofidelic in Belmar, participate in a special sales and exclusive distribution of albums and artist merchandise, with an emphasis on celebrating independently-owned music stores.

"Our store's only been here a little over two years," said Kindler. "A lot of our customers aren't really familiar with what Record Store Day is; some of them are learning."

"It's a group of about 1,400 stores that participates...You have to meet certain guidelines and requirements of your store; brick-and-mortar... locations, and there's a pledge you

have to sign," said Kindler. "There's a list of rules that are dos and don'ts for the store."

He spoke about the titles that are available on Record Store Day however, he clarified that not every store carries every record, and that there is always a limited amount of vinyl to go around. The aim of this is to increase traffic at different physical locations to generate new customers to these unique local businesses, and hopefully keep them coming back throughout the year for more.

"It's made up of a list of titles," said Kindler. "This year there's close to 400 different titles; these titles are only available to the independent record stores that participate in Record Store Day. It's not at Target, it's not on Amazon, it's not anywhere else; it's only exclusive releases to independent record stores that participate."

"Sometimes there are things like represses of older records; whether it's a different color, or an alternate cover or there's a different master." said Kindler's daughter Riley, a current senior at Brick Memorial High School and manager of the store.

Kindler explained that there are several categories of releases for Record Store Day, including "Record Store Day Firsts," which come out on the day of the event but will possibly be rereleased.

"'Record Store Day Exclusives' are the much more desirable titles." he said. "Those are only exclusively printed for that day; once they're done, they're done."

"Along with those titles, the most important part is the quantities," said Kindler. "Most of the [Record Store Day releases] are usually very low in quantity — you're talking 3,000 or fewer pressings. A lot of some of the more desirable ones they might even do 1,500."

Kindler explained that there has been a line around the building in the past few years of Record Store Day

at Clarizio.

"Our first customer has been the same girl the past few years," said Riley. "She gets here for Record Store Day at 11:30 the night before; her mom and her take turns on the sidewalk so I buy them coffee in the morning."

Kindler said that some customers don't realize the minimal quantities of records that are printed for the yearly event, which leads to some people possibly not receiving the exclusives they were expecting.

"That's where our new customers tend to get confused — some people think they can walk in on 4/20...[but] our orders had to go in in the second week of February this year," said Kindler. He further explained that the store polls its customer base using Facebook and other social media to determine what the most sought-after pressings are for the year.

"We put out asking our customers for their requests; what they were interested in," he said. "What we order, because of the limited quantities of

some of these titles, we might not get; we may order 20 and we could get three. We don't know that sometimes until three days before."

Some Record Store Day firsts this vear include: Olivia Rodrigo and Noah Kahan "Stick Season"/"Lacy" from the BBC Radio 1 Live Lounge, Chappell Roan's single "Pink Pony Club" and The 1975 "Live at Gorilla."

Just a few of the Record Store Day Exclusives for this year include a rerelease of stoner duo Cheech and Chong's 1978 soundtrack for "Up in Smoke" on green vinyl, Pearl Jam's new LP "Dark Matter," a picture-disc LP re-pressing of Fleetwood Mac's "Rumours" and "Re: This Is Why," a ruby-colored vinyl remix album of the album "This Is Why" by 2024 Record Store Day ambassadors Paramore.

"The exclusives are what become much more desirable. In the past two Record Store Days there's been a Taylor Swift release...she was the ambassador two years ago. She had a single called 'The Lakes;' there was only 10,000, which is a high number

for Record Store Day, but when you're talking Taylor Swift numbers that's a drop in the bucket," he said.

This year is a bit different; though she is not on the official Record Store Day release list, she does have a release coinciding with the day prior — Taylor Swift's upcoming album "Tortured Poets Department" is set to release on April 19.

According to the Record Store Day official website, "There are a lot of independent stores that participate in Record Store Day. Not all of them will choose to participate in all promotions, or carry all releases. Just because a store is listed here does not mean it will have the goodie or record you're looking for. That said, find a store near you and check with them directly. It's always a good idea to be BFFs with your neighborhood record store."

ANNUAL EVENT

According to the official website for the now-annual event, "The first Record Store Day took place on April 19, 2008. Today, Record Store Day is celebrated at independently-owned brick-and-mortar record stores around the world."

"The great thing about Record Store Day is that it does cover pretty much all genres; it's not all focusing on rock; there's country, jazz is a big one," said Kindler, "When they do come in and pick up these Record Store Day titles, they hopefully and most of them do — shop the rest of the store. It does bring exposure to the store. When we did our first Record Store Day two years ago, we were only open for three months; nobody really knew we were here. but we had people finding us on that day looking for the hot titles that every other store was sold out of."


"This drop was a very big pop one; they really hit contemporary music, also a lot of '90s...It brings younger people — people around my age in here," said Riley, who professed her fandom of the late '90s crooner Jeff Buckley.




