Whether it's a sunset pedal around a lake or a whale watching excursion out on the ocean, there's something for everyone this summer at the Shore

s the summer season rapidly approaches, one of the many ways to enjoy the Jersey Shore is by boat. Throughout Monmouth and Ocean County, there are hundreds of charter boats, pleasure cruises and fishing trips that can create lasting memories and fun days on the water.



ooking to reel in the catch of a lifetime? Up and down the Jersey Shore, fishing charters are just a call away. Don't know the first thing about fishing?
No need to worry, veteran captains and crew will guide you throughout the journey on the Atlantic.

If you're looking for a relaxing voyage or sightseeing, there are options for every interest, whether it's a sunset cruise or a whale watching excursion, there is something for everyone along the Jersey Shore this summer. Are you bored of your average everyday land party? No fear, pleasure cruises are here! Bring the party to the sea this summer with a group of your best friends!

Across the coast, there are so many fantastic party boat options to accommodate any celebration, no matter the size. Enjoying the summer by boat is tough to beat, and here are some of N&D's recommendations for how to do exactly that.

MISS BELMAR

The Miss Belmar runs both fishing and whale watching charters out of the Belmar Marina. Want to see some whales? The Miss Belmar guarantees a whale sighting when you book a trip, and if the trip is unsuccessful, no need to worry, you can book a trip for free at a later secondary date. Miss Belmar also runs a series of fishing charters throughout the summer. Fishing the Atlantic for more than 85 years, the Miss Belmar sails daily from 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. for blue fish and stripers and every afternoon from 4:30 to 8:30 p.m. for fluke and bottom fish. QUEEN MARY

Queen Mary, a family owned and operated 85 ft. vessel docked in Point Pleasant, runs fishing trips, sunset cruises, private parties and whale watching excursions throughout the summer season and beyond. The boat runs fishing trips daily from 6:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and targets stripers, sea bass and blue fish with no reservations needed. 

New theater at Bell Works metroburb to provide entertainment

Axelrod Performing Arts Academy and Axelrod Contemporary Ballet will be able to use the theater space

Bell Works is a large complex in Holmdel that contains a wide variety of spaces, including retail businesses, dining locations, indoor golf and even educational services. It is housed on the site of the former Bell Labs but has since become a one-size-fitsall facility with something for everyone.

Now, that facility includes Bell Theater, a new home for theatrical productions, classical music and many other kinds of performances. The theater is run by Axelrod Performing Arts Center, a nonprofit organization based in Deal that hosts theatrical productions, performing arts workshops and even an annual film festival.

The group already holds a variety of performances at Bell Works. In addition, the Axelrod Performing Arts Academy and the Axelrod Contemporary Ballet Theater both operate out of Bell Works. Now, though, the group will be able to make full use of the new theater space to further thrill audiences.

"It's just going to completely enhance the experi-



ence here, change the complexion of what can happen here," said Andrew DePrisco, Axelrod's executive artistic director.

Built in the space of the old lecture hall, which recently had only hosted several events each month, Bell Theater seats about 285 people, according to DePrisco. The lecture hall was refurbished 10 years ago, but now there is a bigger stage that is closer to the audience, new lighting and sound systems. There is also a dressing room, an enhanced backstage and new curtains.

"It's been quite the process," said DePrisco. He said that the conversation for a new theater first began in 2022, when Axelrod was planning an outdoor concert on the deck at Bellworks. It was sold out, but looming inclement weather meant that the concert would not have gone well; thus, an idea was formed to hold the concert downstairs in the lecture hall.

"It was a great success that weekend," said De-Prisco, who added that the concert's success created the possibility that the space could be used for something more. "Some of the people at Bell Works expressed interest in it being a theater, and that started a conversation with the owner."

Though Bell Works already offers guests a variety of activities, from shopping to office space and entertainment, having a theater could serve to transform the experience even more.

"This is an incredible, unique facility," said DePrisco. "I think that bringing culture to this venue...to actually have a creative team that's bringing live theater and live music and other kinds of entertainment...it just totally adds to the experience of Bell Works."

For those interested in seeing what the new theater has to offer, a list of upcoming events is available on its website, belltheater.org. The website states that the theater has wheelchair accessibility and assistive listening devices, so anyone can come enjoy the fun.

A description of the musical on the theater website states, "celebrates America's resilience and goal of becoming a 'more perfect union."

The next musical, "Million Dollar Quartet," will run from July 19 to 28. This musical has won a Tony award and, this time is directed by Hunter Foster, a member of the original cast.

It tells the story of "a once-in-a-lifetime recording session at Memphis' Sun Studio with Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Carl Perkins and Jerry Lee Lewis," ac-



Fotinos family history infuses rich flavors

Forty years at Scarborough Fair only sweetens authentic flavors

The exquisite and authentic flavors on the menu are the main focus of the Scarborough Fair team including Elias Fotinos, who is an owner along with his parents Mike and Eva Fotinos, and General Manager Jay Manzella. Michael Cox is just as detail-oriented on the flavors of the cocktails as bar manager.

With all these culinary minds coming together, your taste buds will surely thank you for visiting Scarborough Fair. Located right off Highway 35 in Wall Township, Scarborough Fair does not lack atmosphere. Upon entering, you'll wind your way up the staircases laden with booth seating to find yourself at a beautifully designed bar area that was renovated in 2020. Sitting in the stairway booths affords your evening some intimacy and ambience amongst your dining party, while the bar seating often hosts a more lively and friendly crowd. Fair offers a nice bar menu, as well. Outdoor seating in the garden area will offer warm-weather options for diners.

Start your meal off with the Spanakopita — or spinach pie — for authentic Greek flavors of baked phyllo, spinach, feta cheese and fresh dill. "We've had this on the menu for 15 or 20 years," Elias said. "It's very tasty. It's very light." The Fotinos family hails from Greece and visits annually, typically in November to help with their family's harvest of olives.

The spring menu preparation of Scarborough Fair's lump crab cake includes an asparagus coulis and is served with an asparagus relish in Belgian endive dishes with a caper remoulade. The crab cake is uniquely gluten free, using a corn-based breading. The crispiness of the cake provides a nice crunch of decadent crab and a dip of the coulis and the remoulade sauces finish out the flavors perfectly.

The spring menu also boasts a beautiful rack of lamb marinated in EVOO, fresh herbs and spices. The chop is served with a Jersey corn risotto topped with summer roasted vegetables. A rosemary demi glaze finishes off the dish. If you're a salmon fan, you'll enjoy this spring's salmon preparation — fresh herb-crusted Faroe Island salmon served with grilled squash skewers and a side of creamy polenta. This dish is topped with a Caribbean Jerk sauce. Elias says, "It's going to have a little heat," but it's just the right amount.

Compliment your meal with a cocktail from the bar. Classic cocktails like Manhattans, old fashioneds and martinis are favorites at Scarborough. If you're looking for something more unique, give the Sucker Punch a taste — passion fruit liqueur, coconut rum, fresh lime, agave, and a "trade secret" pomegranate foam are all topped with coconut flakes. This drink is a vacation in a glass. Bar Manager Michael Cox says, "It's delicious," and points out that this popular cocktail is dairy free and vegan.




